Hancock-Wood Electric Cooperative's annual business meeting, which reviews the cooperative's financial information, construction projects, and our election results from districts 3, 6, and 8, will remain virtual this year.

The 2025 virtual annual meeting will be held on June 11 at 10 a.m. To participate in the virtual meeting, simply register on our website at www.hwe.coop and a link will be sent to your email prior to the 10 a.m. meeting.

All members who register to attend will be placed in a drawing for a \$300 bill credit. The video will be available for viewing on our YouTube page, on our Facebook page, and at www.hwe.coop. Members in district 6 will be receiving election ballots to vote for a trustee to represent their district. Members will be able to vote online or by mail; we cannot accept any ballots at our office.

Because no other members submitted petitions to run for the board, a formal election for the following districts is not necessary and these districts will not receive ballots. This saves the co-op mail and election costs. The two candidates will be elected by affirmation and be sworn into office during the June Annual Meeting.
